Guidelines for Youth Service Fund Applications

Purpose and Mission

The purpose of Young People's Ministries is to empower young people as world-changing disciples of Jesus Christ, to nurture faith development, and to equip young leaders. The Youth Service Fund was established by the global United Methodist Church to support youth and youth ministries in their endeavors to live and grow as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ.

Guidelines for Selection of YSF Projects

When applying for Youth Service Fund (YSF) grants, the following items will receive careful consideration. It is these areas that we examine most thoroughly. Be as clear and concise in your responses as possible.

- 1. Priority will be given to those projects that are youth-led.
 - (i.e. youth, 12-18 years of age, have been leaders in the creation, development, implementation and evaluation of a project.)
- 2. YSF money is to be used to develop new projects or expand existing ministries that will become self-supporting. There is no guarantee of funding after one year. YSF grants will not be used to fund a deficit or partially or fully pay salary or commission.
- 3. YSF grants should have a substantial impact on the project but will not fund the entire project.
- 4. Projects should be racially and ethnically inclusive whenever possible.
- 5. Preference will be given to United Methodist projects within the connectional system. Projects of other churches and cooperative efforts between religious groups will be favored next. Finally, projects sponsored by secular organizations that meet Youth Service Fund criteria will be considered.
- 6. Applications will be accepted April 1, 2017 October 31, 2017.

Project Selection

- 1. The YPMC will review all applications in November 2017.
- **2.** Applicants will receive a letter informing them of the approval or denial of funds in December 2017.
- **3.** Funds will be disbursed to selected applicants in January 2018.
- **4.** Applicants receiving funding will be asked to submit:
 - **a.** A written progress report on the project by April 1, 2018 to include:
 - i. status of the project
 - ii. additional amounts of funds raised
 - iii. number of participants (actual or anticipated)
 - iv. number of people impacted by the project (actual or anticipated)
 - v. photographs
 - **b.** A full written report on the project by November 1, 2018
 - i. total amounts of funds raised
 - ii. total number of participants
 - iii. total number of people impacted by the project
 - iv. photographs
